This Endowment provides up to \$25,000/year in grant money to one or two worthy applicant(s).

GRANT GUIDELINES

- Awards are intended to support the preparation of manuscripts leading to book-length publications of archaeological research conducted legally and ethically.
- Preference will be given to publications that result from INA-sponsored or INA-affiliated excavations, especially if the grant might ensure that a completed manuscript is submitted during the lifetime of one or both of those in whose honor the endowment was created.
- Applicants may seek funding for expenses such as: faculty leave to support dedicated writing time, travel to conduct relevant research leading directly to publication, as well as manuscript preparation (artifact photography, illustrations, the hiring of necessary support staff) and subvention (indexing, color plates, expanded site plans, etc).
- Applications must be submitted by October 1. Following review by the INA Publications Committee, awarding decisions will be announced December 1.
- Applicants must ensure that obligations of previous INA funding have been met before a new INA funding proposal will be considered.
